# National Symposium

Advancements in medical sciences and technology have revolutionized health care delivery. However, availability, accessibility, affordability and acceptability of quality health care still remain major challenges. It is crucial to attempt appropriate balance between disease prevention, health promotion and medical treatment. Globally, a holistic view of health care and prevention strategies has been gaining recognition. India has a rich tradition of indigenous health systems- Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, Sowa Rigpa along with Naturopathy and Homeopathy in active practice. These AYUSH systems have the potential to play an important role in public health, hitherto undermined.

Currently there is a highly receptive environment in the country and National Health Policy 2017 strongly emphasizes mainstreaming the potential of AYUSH. The Honorable Prime Minister's vision for 'New India' endeavoring to empower the youth, women and poor is indeed laudable. # **Background**

Interdisciplinary School of Health Sciences (ISHS) at the Savitribai Phule Pune University is engaged in training and research in public health. Over two decades, this department has contributed to research and development activities in the AYUSH sector especially in public health. bioprospecting, Ayurvedic biology, Informatics and scientific publishing. The Center for Complementary and Integrative Health (CCIH) has been recently established by the University at ISHS to foster high quality scientific research, training, capacity building, policy analysis, advocacy, networking and translation for strengthening AYUSH systems with a vision to contribute to public health. In recognition of the work in integrative and complementary health, the Ministry of AYUSH has awarded a Center of Excellence (CoE) to ISHS to strengthen interdisciplinary studies with a focus on preclinical research. The CoE pilot project on development of therapeutic adjuvants involves

IISER, NCCS, Serum Institute of India Pune, and Manipal University from India as well as MSKCC and NIH/NCI as collaborators from the USA.

The CCIH as University Center is hosting all the activities of the CoE. The Center will organize academic programs, build research network, initiate research in non-communicable diseases, facilitate human resource development, and meta-research as per the mandate of AYUSH CoE. Additionally, the Center has received a grant for human resource development from the Department of Health Research, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Through this award, the center will execute a national level transdisciplinary research fellowship program in integrative medicine. The fellowship is to address development of human resources through collaborative endeavors between ancient and modern medical knowledge systems.

#### Center of Excellence for Preclinical Research

Ministry of AYUSH has awarded a grant for Center of Excellence to ISHS that aims to build collaborative research network of premium institutes from India and abroad for strengthening research in AYUSH, to demonstrate value of Ayurveda based therapeutic adjuvants in management of NCDs, to facilitate human resource development and to develop strategies based on policy and analysis.

Collaborators in this Center - Serum Institute of India Ltd (SIIL), National Center for Cell Sciences (NCCS), Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Pune; Manipal University's School of Life Sciences (MUSLS), Manipal; National Cancer Institute (NCI) of National Institutes of Health (NIH), USA; and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Care Center (MSKCC), USA.

#### Transdisciplinary Research Fellowship in Integrative Medicine

For creating a new research cadre for 'New India', a novel human resource capacity building initiative of CCIH is supported by Dept. of Health Research, Govt of India. It has a uniquely designed transdisciplinary curriculum for faculty /

scientist from AYUSH and biomedicine. It provides a three month on campus fully supported national fellowship at CCIH including Integrative Research project and eligibility for startup grants.
